

How to Find Us

We are based in the main St Martin's Hospital building at the Clara Cross Centre.

Car Parking

There are three spaces available outside the clinic area at the entrance to the hospital site on Frome Road. Alternatively there is free parking on site through the main entrance to the hospital site on Midford Road.

Public Transport

From Bath city centre, the No.3 bus leaves the city centre every 15 minutes and stops outside the hospital on Midford Road.

Alternatively you can park at the Odd Down Park and Ride. The No.42 (RUH Park & Ride Service) leaves the Odd Down Park & Ride (approximately every 30 minutes). The bus stop for St Martin's Hospital is just before the Red Lion Public House (The Beeches).

From the bus stop, cross the road, and walk towards the large roundabout, turn right into Frome Road. The entrance to St Martin's Hospital is opposite Sainsbury's supermarket.

Parkinson's and Related Disorders

The Clinic:

This specialist clinic is for people who have been diagnosed with Parkinson's or a related disorder such as: Progressive Supranuclear Palsy (PSP), Multi System Atrophy (MSA), Corticobasal Degeneration (CBD), and Dementia with Lewy Bodies (DLB).

We Aim To:

- Empower you to manage your condition.
- Offer practical support to maintain everyday activities/quality of life.
- To be an information point for resources in the community.
- Provide a service that is accessible to you when you require support.

Research:

There may be an opportunity for you to get involved with research. Please ask.

Your Appointment:

Once you have been referred to the clinic, we aim to contact you within 16 weeks.

Your appointment will be provided in the most appropriate location for you. For example, in the clinic or in your own home. It may be via video link, or the telephone, or face to face

You may be offered an individual appointment or you might be given the opportunity to join one of our group sessions.

For people new to the service you may be invited to attend one of our newly diagnosed sessions.

You are welcome to have a relative or carer with you for any appointments

If you are unable to attend or do not require an appointment, please contact us as soon as possible. Your appointment can then be offered to another person.

If you have any questions about your appointment, feel free to contact us.

Please can you complete and bring with you any paperwork we have sent to you.

Investigations that may be completed at your appointment include:

- Blood pressure
- ECG's
- Weight
- Memory screening
- Specialist therapy assessments

On Going Future Support

Once referred to the clinic you will remain under our care. You will be offered a review with a specialist on a yearly basis. However, you may contact the clinic directly to ask advice on any matters relating to your Parkinson's condition that concerns you:
